### **Lines of the Small Blanket**

<b>After Block</b>	<b>Next to Block</b>	<b>On top of Block</b>	<b>Bind Off Row</b>
<b>17</b>	17	17	Yes
<b>18</b>	18		Yes
<b>19</b>		19	Yes
<b>20</b>	19/20		Yes








### **Lines of the Medium and Large Blanket**

<b>After block</b>	<b>Next to Block</b>	<b>On top of Block</b>	<b>Bind Off Row</b>
<b>17</b>	17	17	Yes
<b>18</b>	18		NO
<b>19</b>		19	Yes
<b>20</b>	19/20	18/20	yes

<b>Block 17</b>	<b>Large Square</b>	<b>design: Dini</b>
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In this Block we will be using a new technique with new symbols in the chart. We are going to crochet some stitches together during the return pass. I used 2 different symbols as you will need to make the chain on the left or right side. The other new symbol is to create a clean look.

<b>Foundation Row 1</b>
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### Forward Pass

- The border loop is in the marked stitch. Then working behind the rows, pick up 13 loops, skip the border of the vertical line, pick up 4 loops across vertical line, skip the border edge, pick up 30 loops across Block 4, then pick up a border loop. Pick up the loops as normal. (49 loops).

### Return Pass

Pull through 1 loop, pull through 2 loops 5 times, *\*chain 1 (pull through 1 loop), pull through 3 loops, pull through 2 loops 6 times, pull through 3 loops, chain 1 (pull through 1 loop), pull through 2 loops 4 times, repeat \* \* 2 times* pull through 2 loops.

<b>Row 2</b>
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Follow the chart.

### Into Open Space

Insert your hook under the chain of the return pass, into the open space, pull up a loop.

### Hook underneath 2tog TSS

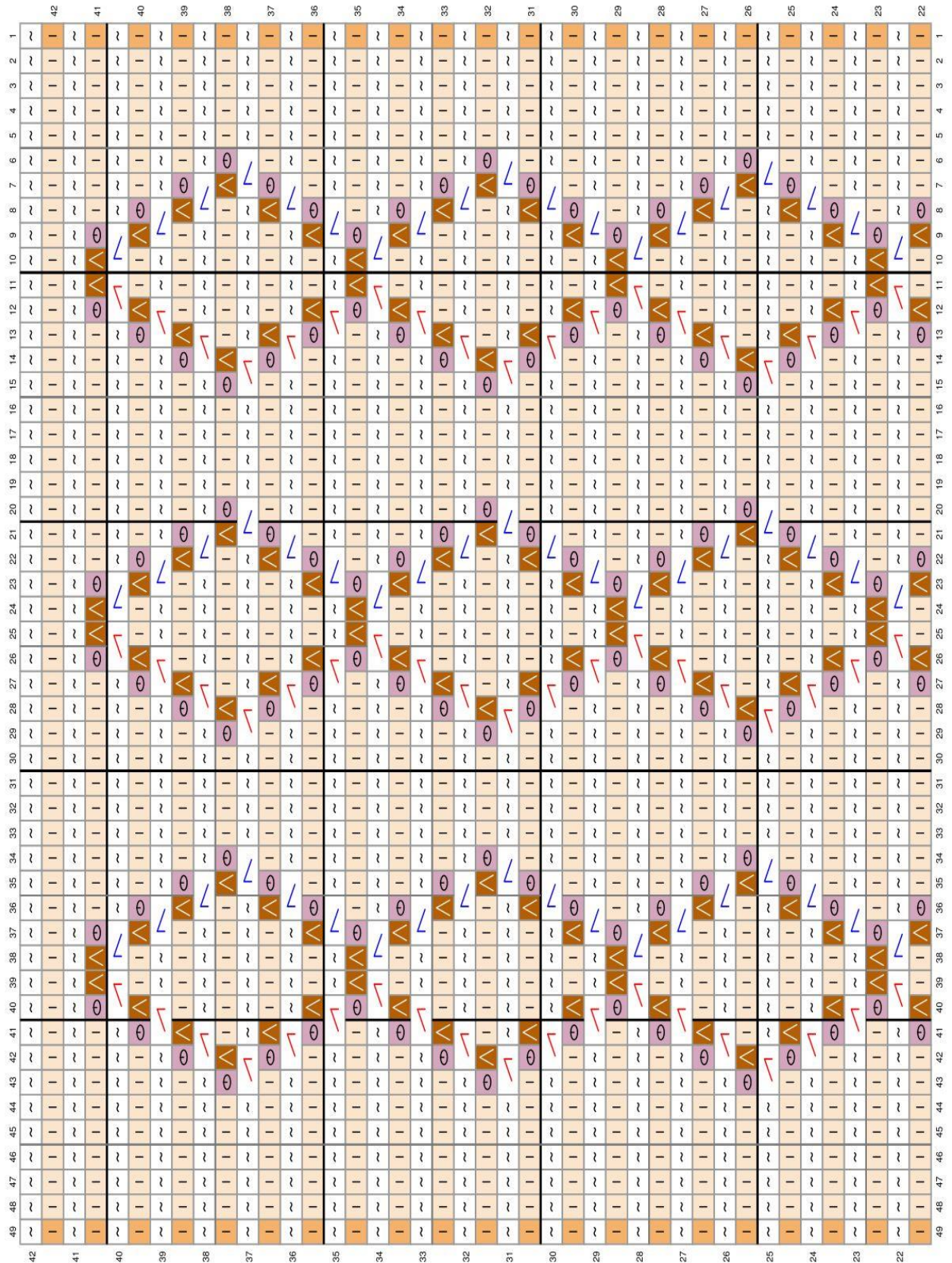
Insert the hook under both vertical bars (TSS in previous row) and pull up a loop.

<b>Block 18</b>	<b>Rectangle</b>	<b>design: Dini</b>
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We are going to work a new stitch that is a variation on the TKS (Tunisian Knit Stitch). The way you insert your hook is what creates this stitch. The name says a lot, we are going to twist the knit stitch. The only thing that is different is the direction and how you insert your hook. So pick up your swatch and practice this stitch for several rows. Make sure you have worked a row of TSS before you start with the Twisted TKS.

### Twisted Tun Knit Stitch

Insert your hook from **LEFT TO RIGHT** from front to back (like a TKS) into the next stitch and pull up a loop.

Work a few rows of the Twisted TKS on your swatch before you continue working on the blanket.

The chart is continued on the next page making it possible to be presented in one piece, not split.

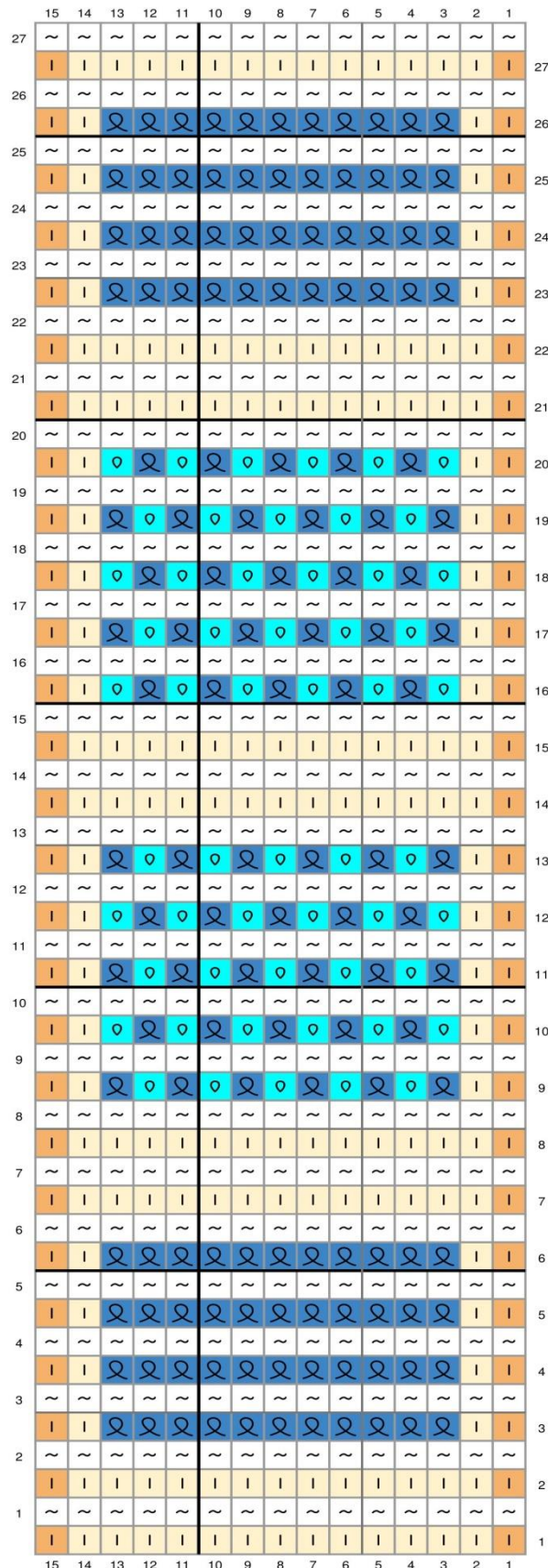
Working behind the rows, in the 15<sup>th</sup> stitch to the LEFT of the RIGHT edge of the Line above Block 17, attach your yarn to the back of the stitch, pick up 13 additional loops, and a border loop. (15 loops)

**Block 19****Rectangle****design: Marjolein**

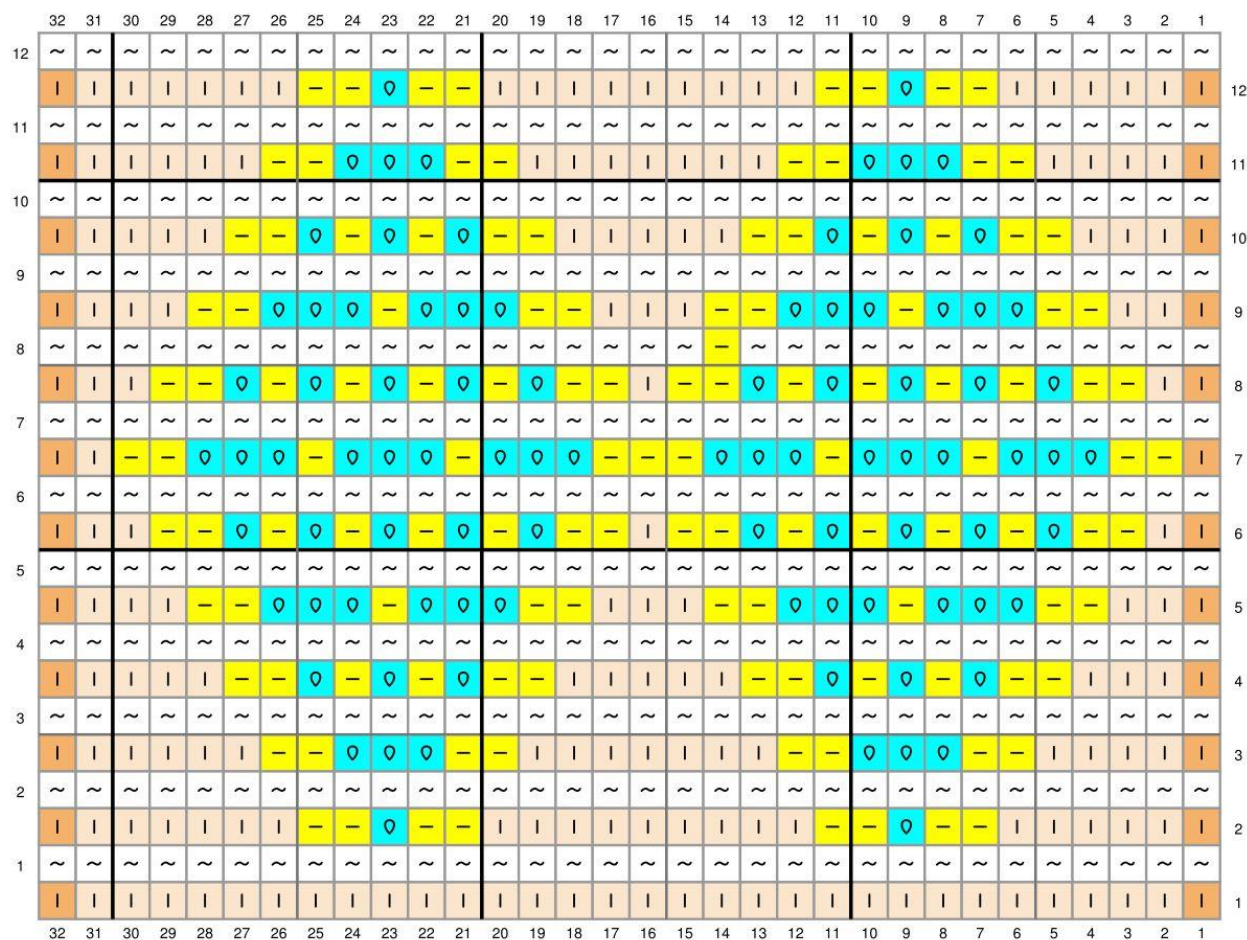
I found a lovely knit pattern and have translated it into Tunisian Crochet.

**Working behind the rows, attach your yarn in the LEFT CORNER stitch next to Block 17, picking up 30 additional loops and a connection. (32 loops)**

**Abbreviations**

<b>TSS</b>	<i>Tun Simple Stitch</i>
<b>TPS</b>	<i>Tun Purl Stitch</i>
<b>TKS</b>	<i>Tun Knit Stitch</i>

**Block 20** *rectangle* *design: Marjolein*

This pattern looks fantastic if you continue it for a scarf or cardigan.

Pay attention to the cable. You need to cross **3 TKS over 3 TPS**.

**Working behind the rows, attach yarn in the LEFT CORNER of the line above Block 19, pick up 30 loops, and your connection. (32 loops)**
